Dear Families,

We continually promote and review safety in and around our building. Emergencies could occur at any time, without notice. There are many things we cannot control and the best way to protect ourselves and your children at the school is by having good procedures and practice.

This past Friday we conducted our annual school wide Earthquake Release drill.
The drill was a huge success, with many

The drill was a huge success, with many families commenting on how smooth it was for school pick up especially knowing that not all parents would typically arrive at the same time during an earthquake. Staff did note that several parents did not have an accurate list of approved adults to pick up their child. Please make sure you maintain a current Emergency Release information and notify the school office of any new changes (e.g. approved adults for pick up, new address and/or emergency contact phone numbers).

Traffic Safety: PLEASE NOTE Brandon Street during school drop off and pick up times are extremely busy and we need your continued support in keeping our students safe. We are asking everyone to slow down while driving in the school zone, encourage your children to use the cross walks and refrain from darting out between cars, and NO drop off or pickups

in the staff parking lot. The safety of our students and families are most important.

Peanut and Nut Aware School--Parents and Caregivers are reminded that Ecole Inman is a peanut and nut aware school. This means that we do have staff and students that have allergic reactions (which can be severe) to peanut products as well as tree nuts. Please check the contents of your children's snacks and be mindful to NOT send peanut/ nut products or by products to school. The most popular item parents send to school are Nutella Sandwiches. Please note, despite the fact it is a chocolate spread, it is made from Hazelnuts.

We appreciate your support in keeping all of our students safe. If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Parking Lot Safety



Please remember that our parking area is very limited and, at times, we can barely fit our staff vehicles for the day. Many people expect to find parking for drop off and pick up at the school, but that is not possible. Available appropriate parking spaces for drop off and pick up purposes are extremely rare. Our school is within walking distance for almost all our students so we recommend

that families walk, even in the rain. When students walk to school, the exercise and fresh air gets their brain ready and they are calmer and ready to learn when they enter the school. Our school welcomes the enforcement of traffic and parking rules for the safety of our students by the RCMP. Violators of traffic and parking rules will be ticketed.

For the safety of our students, there is no entrance to the staff parking lot for parent drop off or pick-up. Please avoid using the playground thru the staff parking lot as a shortcut to access Brandon Street. This helps to ensure the safety of our students who dart from the sidewalk through the parking lot. We know this requires you to walk into the grounds, but we ask for your support in abiding these safety standards.
