- 4. Principal's Report/Head Teacher's Report Update on school year
 - We are officially fully staffed. We have been bumped a full day of ELL so we welcome back Mrs. Eisler who will be joining us on Wednesdays working with some of our Level 1 ELL students.
 - Volleyball is in full swing (pun intended). We have a full gym during our coed practices and the boys play on Tuesdays and the girls play on Thursdays. By the end of the season, we are hoping to field a recreational level team, a competitive team and a coed tournament team, however the main goal is to inspire students to love the sport and tryout at Moscrop in their grade 8 year.
 - Thank you to all the parents who showed up to their goal setting meetings. Super pleased with the Bookings app that we used.
 - Our reconciliation week focusing on truths around residential schools culminated in a moving ceremony in which the week's learning was shared and we also had a number of students share personalized land acknowledgements. Our students are learning the purpose and deeper meaning behind why we do land acknowledgements.

5. Spring Concert Updates

(Mrs. Nordstrand)

- Oh the things you can think.... A line you will hear your child singing this April. Our school wide concert is moving to April 2024. On April 17 and 18 our gym will be transformed to a world of Horton the Elephant, The Cat in the Hat, the Who's and more. All Inman students with the support of the staff will present: "Seussical The Musical". Students will be performing in two shows. Cast students will be in four shows.
- The school will be divided into two groups performing on one date at 1:30 and 6:30 pm. Each class will be involved in an opening number, a class number, and then a finale number. Students in Grade 6 and 7 have the opportunity to be one of the 25 members of the cast. Students in Grades 4, 5, 6, and 7 can be part of the chorus in which they will learn all the songs from the show.
- This is a step away from our annual December concerns. My stockroom is full of 16 years of costumes (yes, if you did some fast math I started teaching here at Inman in 2007), most of which will not be used for this production. I am excited to direct a Broadway Kids Musical instead of a publisher musicals I have used in the past, but with that there are many more costs. Whereas winter concerns have cost around \$300 to purchase Seussical is around \$800 with exchange. Needing a whole show of costumes will add to our budget as well as our usual set, microphone and lighting expenses.
- So where can you come in? We will need people to shop and sew for costumes. If you have expertise in lighting and sound I would welcome your involvement. Ticket orders need to be processed. I already have a parent scouting for halloween costumes. This community has always come alongside and helped in amazing ways. I'm grateful for that. So send me an email if you have a way you want to help, or watch for my volunteers needed requests. Of course funding is helpful too, and I would welcome more than my usual \$500 (that buys instruments for our classroom or resources thank you for that!).
- You may wonder why Seussical. I sat in a live audience for the first time in a long time last spring and watched Alight Entertainments performance of this show. The opening number started and my eyes started to leak. The music grabbed me numerous times, and this is always a starting place for when I need to help something come alive for the students.
- One of the playful songs in the show has the lyrics "Anything's possible". I can't wait to see what is possible for our Inman Students. Thank you for having me here tonight. I'm happy to take questions.

13. New Business

- Safety of stone/wooden benches
 - i. What is the intended purpose, and how are communicating the purpose to students/staff, so that they are not using the area for a play area (injuries have occurred).
 - ii. Gathering space/outdoor education area around the indigenous garden, would have gone through ground's evaluation of the safety there is a situation currently under investigation under school protection; moveable logs have been removed but 3 logs are still present. Trees have been planted there. There has been a reduction in number of children who are playing in the area and jumping off the objects/logs.
 - iii. Referred to as gathering space not as a play area, noon hour supervisors/teachers aware of this (will discourage play in this area, in addition to other less safe areas). Communicated to students that it is not a play area by classroom teachers.
 - iv. Is there a way to fence/cone/barricade off the area with additional signage to indicate that it is a gathering/outdoor area only (potentially district wide)?
 - This would need to be put forth to District
- Clarification of inclement weather policy "West Coast recess" weather has fluctuated this past week with varying amounts of rain
 - i. Undercover areas around the school that children can use
 - ii. Some families may not have the means to obtain rain gear; school has some funds that can assist if required.
 - iii. Dave will bring this up with staff
